Mature Height : 4-6 Feet

Black-Eyed Susan Goldsturm Rudbeckia



Blooms midsummer to early fall

Reaches standard mature height of 24 to 36 inches

Walker's Low Catmint Perennial



Compact plants with gray-green foliage. Unbelievable flower display with large, lavender-blue flowers all summer. Hardy Zones 3-8. Mature Height: 18-24. Deer Resistant.

Liriope muscari 'Silvery Sunproof'



Slow growing mounding evergreen grass to 15-18 inches tall.

Lilac flowers appear in summer.
Leaves are variegated.

Little Spire Russian Sage



The more compact habit of 'Little Spire' makes this a better choice for smaller gardens. Standing around 24 inches when in full bloom, 'Little Lace' can nicely be planted with shorter plants in a border, or use it as a airy filler in sparse areas of your garden. The silvery green foliage is very lacy creating a nice base for the lavender blue flowers that bloom from midsummer until the fall. The flowers make excellent cut or dried flower arrangements. 'Little Spire' is an improved dwarf selection that stays compact and does not flop over. An overall excellent perennial that is drought tolerant and virtually maintenance free.

Mount Airy Fothergilla gardenii Shrub



The show begins in spring, when dainty white blooms (about an inch across) appear, sporting a marvelous honey scent and bright, cheery look. After they pass, the small, neatly veined leaves keep 'Mount Airy' looking lush and beautiful all summer. Then, when the first chill of fall enters the air, the foliage turns ultra-bright shades of golden and orange!

Plant Height 4 ft - 5 ft

Limelight Hydrangea



Type: Deciduous shrub

Height: 6 to 8 feet

Spread: 6 to 8 feet

Bloom Time: July to September

Flowers emerge creamy white, mature to chartreuse-lime and eventually acquire pink-darkening-to-rose tones before finally fading to beige. As the flower show fades in fall, the oval to ovate, serrate, dark green leaves (to 4" long) turn attractive shades of red

Green Velvet Boxwood Shrub



The Green Velvet Boxwood retains the upright, rounded shape you'd expect from a boxwood on its own, with little to no pruning from you. This evergreen shrub boasts deep green, glossy leaves all year, making it attractive in all four seasons. In the spring, you'll enjoy its tiny white blossoms, which are actually quite fragrant (a rarity with boxwoods). Maturing to a height of 4-6 ft

Norway Spruce



Is the fastest growing of the spruces.

Is easy to transplant.

Can be planted on a wide variety of sites.

Works well for windbreaks.

Features dark green needles that are roughly $\frac{1}{2}$ –1" in length and feel square when rolled between your fingers.

Yields light brown, stiffly scaled, 4–6" cones that sit upright on the branch until fertilized. Once fertilized, they gradually turn downward.

Grows in a pyramidal shape.
